1. Apply for Coupon

Between now and March 31, 2009, you have two ways to request a coupon (while supplies last):

- Apply online: www.DTV2009.gov
- Call the 24-hour hotline: 1-888-DTV-2009 (1-888-388-2009)

2. Receive Coupon

Once you have your coupon(s), you have 3 months before expiration. Coupons redeemable with certified converter boxes only.

2009 Digital Television Transition FAQs



The federal government is requiring high powered 'local' broadcast television stations (ABC, NBC, CBS, FOX, PBS, the CW, MyNetworkTV plus more) to turn off their analog channels and broadcast exclusively in the clearer, better digital television (DTV) format starting at midnight **February 17, 2009**.



Will I be Affected by the DTV Transition?

If you receive free local television signals through an over-the-air antenna (OTA) you will be affected. If you only use cable or satellite you will NOT be affected.

What will I Need to Receive Digital Signals?

If you use an OTA antenna with an analog TV to receive local stations (ABC, NBC, CBS, FOX, PBS, the CW, MyNetworkTV plus others), you must either purchase a new digital TV or buy a converter box. A converter box plugs into your existing analog TV set and OTA antenna, enabling you to receive local DTV stations FREE – with no monthly programming fees.

Winegard has 2 different models to choose from:



RC-DT09A with analog pass-through converts digital OTA signals and provides your analog TV with analog signals. The RC-DT09A is certified by the NTIA to be used in conjunction with \$40 government coupons.

RC-1010 has an HD tuner for HDTVs that do not have an ATSC HD tuner built in. This box is not eligible for the government converter box coupon program.



How does the \$40 Government Converter Box Coupon Program Work?

The federal government is providing \$40 coupons that can be used toward the purchase of certified DTV converter boxes. The Winegard Digital to Analog Converter Box, RC-DT09A, qualifies for this coupon program. Households can apply for up to two coupons, valued at \$40 each, which must be redeemed at certified retailers. To find out more about certified retailers, visit www.winegard.com/DTV. 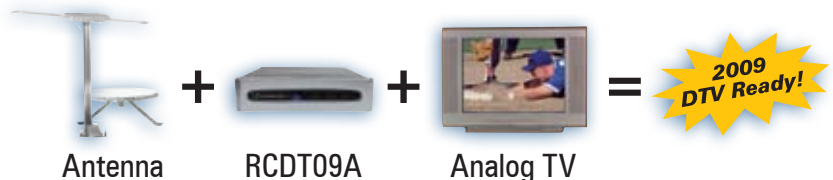
Switch Today!
